Internship Objectives:

- Identify ways that we can regulate and manage the use of AI and the implications (and trade-offs) for communities, including pathways for advocacy and bridging the digital divide!
- 2) Design and implement survey questions regarding AI policy for community members so you can collect, analyze, and communicate data you've collected!
- 3) Engage with community members, including neighbors and peers, using the survey to gather their perspectives on AI to shape advocacy plans!

About BARI: BARI is a center at Northeastern University that collaborates with local communities to ensure that data and technology are used to make Boston a more equitable city.

About Tech Goes Home (TGH): Tech Goes Home is a non-profit technology advocacy group based in Boston that empowers communities to access and use digital tools to overcome barriers and advance lives.

How We'll Do It

With teamwork! You will work with TGH's Community Advocacy Fellows. The Fellows are adult professionals who, just like you, are examining how emergent technology impacts us all. You will partner with them to pick a public policy or regulation regarding artificial intelligence and digital equity. You will research how that policy could impact Boston if it were applied here and the potential arguments for or against it. Based on your conclusions, you will create a survey to be submitted to the public! After collecting and analyzing the results, your team will prepare a report to be presented in two phases:

- 1. In front of your fellow interns, fellows, and colleagues from BARI and TGH on Wednesday, August 14, 2024
- 2. In front of elected officials at a later date. Note: if this date occurs past the end of the internship, you will still be paid \$15/hr for your participation.

Please remember to bring your laptop to *EVERY SESSION*! You will need it! We cannot provide laptops/technology this summer, but Northeastern can provide you with a letter for your school requesting you be allowed to use your school-issued Chromebooks during the summer.

Intern Stipends

You will earn \$15 dollars per hour for each hour of active participation in both the internship portions of the program. "Active participation" means showing up, doing the work both in and out of BARI and TGH, asking questions, and being a good listener.

C2C staff will assist you in signing up for payment during your internship orientation during Week 1.

Intern Expectations

Present and active participation: Like any other job (you will be paid, after all), it is expected that you show up ready to work, participate, and listen in a way that is open, friendly, and respectful. Remember: we are all in this together!

Ask Questions!: I am always happy to answer questions if someone is feeling stuck, but I believe that your fellow interns are the best resource. If you have a question, raise your hand and we will all work on an answer together. If you feel more comfortable Googling it, that's also fine.

Unplanned Absences: Staying safe is a responsibility that we all must take seriously. Remember that our individual actions will help everyone stay safe. If you don't feel well, it's okay to stay home–just communicate as early as you can!

Planned Absences: We get it... it's summer! You might have plans to travel with friends or family, and that's fine. However, it is YOUR responsibility to let us and those you work with that you will be absent! It is also your responsibility to make sure you all have a plan to ensure that the work gets done! We will NOT let others know for you!
